
Read "Unicorns of the Sea" then answer the questions that follow.

Unicorns of the Sea

Whales **inhabit**, or <u>live</u>, in the ocean. All whales are mammals, but only one whale has a long tusk. This whale is the narwhal. It is called "the unicorn of the sea."

The narwhal's tusk is **fascinating**. Scientists want to learn more about it. The narwhal has teeth, but unlike other toothed whales, its teeth are not inside its mouth. The male grows a tooth straight from its jaw. This is its tusk. Female narwhals usually do not grow a tusk.

All whales are mammals that live in water. They all breathe air. But only the unicorn of the sea has a tusk!
